



ArtScience Fellowship/Artist in Residence information

We offer a special fellowship to an artist to work on an ArtScience project in collaboration with UvA-researchers and students at the IAS. The practical arrangements will be tailored to your personal situation and the nature of your practice.

What does the ArtScience fellowship include?

- a 'home base' at the IAS: flexible work space and use of facilities¹;
- an inspiring environment with many bright and creative minds;
- networking support;
- organisational support for events (e.g. workshops, lectures);
- seed funding to support your ArtScience project (max EUR 3.000).
- a needs-based cost compensation (e.g. for travelling, accommodation);
- if relevant, a stipend to compensate for lost earnings for the duration of the fellowship.

Please note that this fellowship provides **guest status** at the UvA; you are not employed by the UvA.

What we expect from you:

If the fellowship is granted, we expect you to:

- be present at the IAS on a fulltime or part-time basis²;
- participate in IAS activities (social and scientific);
- actively engage with UvA-researchers and students (IAS-affiliates, as well as Art History, Artistic Research etc.);
- acknowledge IAS in any output resulting from the ArtScience fellowship;
- write a short report on your activities and achievements within 2 months after the end of the fellowship.

During your fellowship we support you to:

- work on an ArtScience project together with at least one UvA researcher (leading to some concrete output);
- organise (at least) one lecture or other event (e.g. workshop, lectures, discussion, exhibition, performance).

¹ Depending on the nature of the art practice, additional work space options can be explored together with the Faculty of Humanities.
